



Covid-19 Program Policies

- Campers must be residents of Massachusetts.
- Visitors (including parents) and volunteers are not permitted to stay.
- Campers will be required to follow the policies detailed below. Campers who are unable or unwilling to comply will not be allowed to remain at camp.
- When Indoor Camp has more than 10 campers registered, the campers will be split in two groups and be unable to congregate with the other group of campers for the duration of camp.
 - If your camper is attending with a sibling or a friend, please let our staff know so we can keep them together and happy (if desired).
 - Staff will also be split between campers if we have more than 10 enrollments. Separate activities will be run parallel to each other and staff will not float between groups.
- A water fountain is available, however we encourage all campers to bring their own water bottle that can be refilled at our filtered water station.
- We will not be providing food to campers this season. Please pack snacks and a lunch for our morning snack break, lunch time break, and afternoon snack break if your camper is attending for the full day. Half day campers should bring a morning snack and a lunch.
- We recommend that campers bring their own gear, if possible. Our gear policy is detailed in the next section.

What campers should expect:

- Campers and their parent/guardian will undergo a brief health screening with a contactless thermometer upon entry to the facility. Any camper with a reading of 100.4°F or higher will not be allowed to participate.
- Face coverings will be required at all times. Single use masks can be purchased on site at cost for \$1, but campers are encouraged to bring reusable cloth masks.
- Campers will be expected to routinely wash and/or sanitize their hands in between activities and throughout the day.
- All of our typical games and activities that involve physical contact will be suspended or modified to allow for socially distant play.
- Climbing equipment provided by MetroRock will be reused by the same camper each day. Personal cubby space will be provided for all campers to individually store their belongings throughout the week.
- Gear will be sanitized daily

What campers should expect, cont.:

- Communal rental chalk will not be available for use. Personal chalk bags are allowed. Use of liquid chalk is preferred.
- Chalk bags and chalk balls are available for purchase from our retail area.
- Social distancing protocols will be mandatory and strictly monitored.

What can be expected from our staff:

- Staff has been briefed on the new policies and procedures.
- Staff will undergo a brief health screening, including a contactless temperature reading, upon entry of the facility. Any staff with a reading of 100.4°F or higher will not be allowed to work.
- Any staff members who have exhibited symptoms or have been in contact with someone who has exhibited symptoms within the past 14 days will be asked not to work.
- Face coverings will be required at all times.
- Staff members will be expected to routinely wash and/or sanitize their hands throughout the day.
- Staff members will engage in enhanced cleaning and sanitizing procedures, especially those related to common surfaces throughout the facility.
- Social distancing protocols will be mandatory and strictly monitored.

Outdoor Education Program Specific Policies and Guidelines

- Group size is limited to 8 campers.
- Face masks will be worn at all times.
- Two counselors will always be present.
- While traveling in our vehicles, masks must be worn at all times.
- Campers must remain 6' apart while outdoors.
- All climbing stations will be at least 12' apart at the crag.

We understand that this will be a difficult transition, and are striving to make sure that our campers can still have a great time this summer. This type of precaution is new to us, and we will make every effort to stay up to date and make appropriate changes to our operating procedures. We must, however, institute a zero tolerance policy in regard to these new policies. If campers refuse/are unable to comply, they will be asked to leave or not participate.
